Remind us again that we are Your lights that shine in this world's darkness. Forgive us when we would hide the light you have given us and grant us the courage to let our light, the light of Your truth in us, shine! When we are confused, please grant us clarity. When we are divided, restore and unite us. When we are troubled, help us and heal us. Take away the fears that linger in our hearts by helping us to look beyond this world to the eternal world to come and remind us that it is in Your eternal Kingdom, O Lord, that we are to lay up our treasures where the destructive agents of this world cannot harm them.
